

Heartley "Hunk" Anderson

Calumet High School Athletic Hall of Fame

Lettered in football, baseball, and track at CHS.

Excelled in boxing while attending CHS.

All-American offensive guard at Notre Dame from 1918-1921.

Scored a record three touchdowns as a lineman in a game against Purdue in 1920.

All-Pro offensive guard with the Chicago Bears from 1922-1926.

Named to the NFL's 1920's All-Decade Team as offensive lineman.

Replaced Knute Rockne as head coach at Notre Dame from 1931-1933.

Coached college football at University of St. Louis, Michigan, and Cincinnati.

First coach ever to use a linebacker to "blitz" the opposing quarterback in 1931.

Served as head coach at North Carolina State from 1934-1936.

Served as an assistant coach with the Detroit Lions in 1939.

Replaced George Halas as coach of the Chicago Bears from 1942-1945.

"Hunk Anderson is the greatest line coach that ever lived." George Halas, 1950.

Named to Notre Dame's Top 40 All-Time Fighting Irish List.

Inducted into the inaugural class of the UP Sports Hall of Fame in 1972.

Inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 1974.
