Calumet High School Athletic Hall of Fame

Earned letters in football, basketball, baseball, track at CHS.

Was a three-sport star at Michigan Agricultural College (Michigan State) 1914-1917.

Earned an all-time MSU record of 10 letters in basketball, baseball, football.

Led the Aggies basketball team in scoring with 126 points in 1914-1915.

Set a single-game basketball scoring record with 30 points against Hope College in 1915. His record stood for 35 years.

Selected captain of the Aggies basketball team for the 1915-1916 season.

Served as freshman football coach of the MAC Aggies in 1919, and as head basketball coach from 1920-1922.

Served for 41 years at Michigan State as an athletic department administrator.

Served as the Mayor of East Lansing from 1933-1937.

Established and donated the George Gipp All-American Award to CHS in 1934.

Inducted into the UP Sports Hall of Fame in 1973.

Inducted into the Michigan Sports Hall of Fame in 1976.

Inducted as a charter member of the MSU Hall of Fame in 1992.
