Served as women's track and cross country coach at the University of Arkansas from 1981-1990.

During her tenure as coach, six of her teams were ranked in the top 20 in the nation.

Coached the first Arkansas cross country team to be ranked in the top 10 nationally.

Coached the first Arkansas cross country team to win a SWC championship.

In 1988 was selected the SWC cross country coach of the year.

In 1989 was selected the SWC outdoor track coach of the year.

Was selected to coach Team USA at the 1990 World Junior Cross Country Championships in Aix-Les Baines, France.

Appointed director of women's athletics at Arkansas in 1989 and would serve in that position for 19 years.

As athletic director, she oversaw the addition of four new sports at the university during her tenure; volleyball, golf, gymnastics and softball.

Was inducted into the University of Arkansas Hall of Honor in 1998.

In 2003, she was honored by the university for building and guiding one of the finest and most competitive NCAA women's athletic programs in the country. The brand new women's athletic center on campus was officially named:

The Bev Lewis Center for Women's Athletics.

In 2008, she was appointed to the position of associate vice chancellor and executive associate athletic director. She has since served on the NCAA Management Council, NCAA Championship Cabinet and the SEC executive committee.
