

## **William (Fred) Barry**

### **Calumet High School Athletic Hall of Fame**

An outstanding athlete at CHS (1950-1954) who lettered in football and track while starring in hockey, baseball and softball on local senior teams.

Was selected first team All-U.P. and first team All-State as a running back after the 1953 football season.

In 1953, set school football records for most points in a game (33) against Ashland and most yards rushing in a game (308) against Negaunee.

Played one year of varsity football at Michigan Tech (1954) where he started at running back and returned punts and kick-offs.

For over twenty years (1953-1975) was one of the finest senior hockey players in the Upper Midwest while playing for the CLK Radars and CLK Wolverines.

Was a member of numerous Gibson Cup winning teams and also won a Senior Men's National Hockey Championship as a member of the Portage Lake Pioneers in 1956.

Played in the United States Hockey League with the Des Moines Oak Leafs, Copper Country Chiefs and Marquette Iron Rangers.

Was an outstanding player for Ahmeek in the Copper Country Twilight Baseball League and with Miller's Recreation, CLK Merchants and Carling's in the Copper Country Softball League. Also played in the Upper Peninsula Sunday Baseball league with South Range, Hancock Merchants, and the Copper Sox.

Was invited to major league baseball tryouts with the Kansas City Athletics in 1955 and the New York Giants in 1956.

Inducted into the Upper Peninsula Sports Hall of Fame in 2004.
