Earned 11 letters while at CHS (1959-1963) with three in football and four each in basketball and track.

One of the very few individuals in CHS history to win 11 athletic letters during their career.

Received the George Gipp Award as the outstanding senior athlete in the class of 1963.

Coached football and tennis in Plymouth School District.

Coached youth hockey and baseball in Calumet.

Ran Los Angeles Marathon, Chicago Marathon, Marquette Marathon, New York Marathon, Grandma's Marathon, and the Paavo Nurmi Marathon, along with local marathons, 10K's, 10 milers, and half-marathons from Maine to California.

Ran the Boston Marathon six times, with the first in 1983 with a qualifying time of 2:48.

Served the CLK School District for 31 years (1973-2004) as an Assistant Principal, Community Schools Director, Principal and Superintendent.

Served two years as CHS athletic director (1982-1984) while also serving as principal.

In 1982, as CHS principal and athletic director, helped lead a group of community individuals to form the Calumet All Sports Booster Club.

To this day, the Calumet All Sports Booster Club plays a critical role in providing financial support to Calumet High School athletics.

Tireless supporter of the Public Schools of Calumet-Laurium-Keweenaw and the Calumet High School athletic program.
